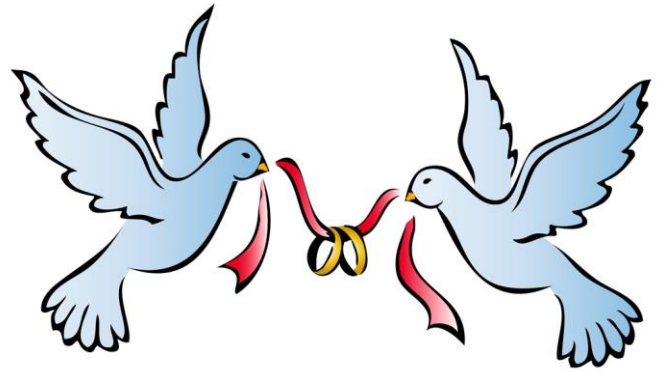

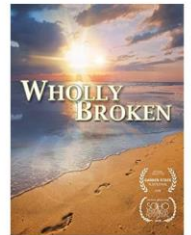
Wholly Broken




