Holy Week

This Sunday, we begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday. Unlike last year where we were unable to celebrate Holy Week, this year we are able to celebrate together although with some changes due to COVID-19 and various restrictions that are still in place. Palm Sunday, we have people who will help to distribute palm; they will be masked and gloved. There will not be a procession and the blessing of the palms will take place in front of the Altar. Monday of Holy Week, we will have confessions from 3pm to 9pm in the Church. We also will have Holy Hour from 8pm to 9pm on Monday. The celebration of Morning Prayer on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday will be celebrated in the Parish Center at 8am and livestreamed on our Website (www.iccwhb.org), Facebook, and Vimeo pages as well as on YouTube later in the day. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday will take place in the Parish Center. There will be no washing of the feet this year due to safety protocol. Likewise there will be no procession nor altar of repose, however, the Blessed Sacrament will be in the Tabernacle of the Parish Center and available for adoration until 11pm. On Good Friday, we will have Stations of the Cross in the Church at 12noon, and 7:30pm in English, and 6pm in Spanish. Liturgy of the Lord's Passion will be in the Parish Center at 3pm. Adoration of the Cross will be done from in front of the Altar without processing and approaching the Cross. Liturgy of the Lord's Passion in Spanish will take place at 8pm in the Parish Center. On Holy Saturday we will have the blessing of food in the Church at 10:30am. The Easter Vigil will be in the Parish Center at 8pm. We will not have the lighting and blessing of the Easter Fire this year, but will light and bless the Easter Candle to start the Easter Vigil. Likewise we will not be using or lighting congregational candles this year. The blessing with Easter Water will take place at the foot of the Altar without a procession both at the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Masses. Easter Sunday Masses will be held in the Parish Center at 8am, 9:30am, 11am in English, and 12:30pm in Spanish. I pray that you and your family have a Blessed Holy Week and Blessed Easter. I am so happy we are able to celebrate these great feasts together! For now, we continue our walk with the Lord.

La Semana Santa

Este domingo, comenzamos la Semana Santa con el Domingo de Ramos. A diferencia del año pasado donde no pudimos celebrar la Semana Santa, este año podemos celebrar juntos aunque con algunos cambios debido al COVID-19 y varias restricciones que aún están vigentes. Domingo de Ramos, tenemos gente que ayudará a distribuir palma; estarán enmascarados y enguantados. No habrá procesión y la bendición de las palmas se realizará frente al Altar. Lunes de Semana Santa, tendremos confesiones de 3pm a 9pm en la Iglesia. También tendremos Hora Santa de 8pm a 9pm los lunes. La celebración de la Oración de la Mañana el Jueves Santo, Viernes Santo y Sábado Santo se celebrará en el Centro Parroquial a las 8am y se transmitirá en vivo en nuestro sitio web (www.iccwhb.org), Facebook y páginas de Vimeo, así como en YouTube más adelante en el día. La Misa de la Cena del Señor del Jueves Santo tendrá lugar en el Centro Parroquial. No habrá lavado de pies este año debido al protocolo de seguridad. Asimismo no habrá procesión ni altar de reposo, sin embargo, el Santísimo Sacramento estará en el tabernáculo del Centro Parroquial y disponible para la adoración hasta las 11 de la noche. El Viernes Santo, tendremos el Vía Crucis en la Iglesia a las 12 del mediodía y a las 7:30pm en inglés y a las 6pm en español. La liturgia de la Pasión del Señor será en el Centro Parroquial a las 3 pm. La Adoración de la Cruz se hará frente al Altar sin procesar y acercándose a la Cruz. La liturgia de la Pasión del Señor en español se llevará a cabo a las 8pm en el Centro Parroquial. El Sábado Santo tendremos la bendición de la comida en la Iglesia a las 10:30 am. La Vigilia Pascual será en el Centro Parroquial a las 8pm. No tendremos el encendido y la bendición del Fuego Pascual este año, pero encenderemos y bendeciremos el Vela Pascual para comenzar la Vigilia Pascual. Asimismo, no usaremos ni encenderemos velas congregacionales este año. La bendición con Agua Pascual tendrá lugar al pie del Altar sin procesión tanto en la Vigilia Pascual como en las Misas del Domingo de Resurrección. Las misas del Domingo de Pascua se llevarán a cabo en el Centro Parroquial a las 8am, 9:30am, 11am en inglés y 12:30pm en español. Oro para que usted y su familia tengan una Semana Santa y una Pascua Benditas. ¡Estoy tan feliz de poder celebrar juntos estas grandes fiestas! Por ahora continuamos nuestro camino con el Señor.

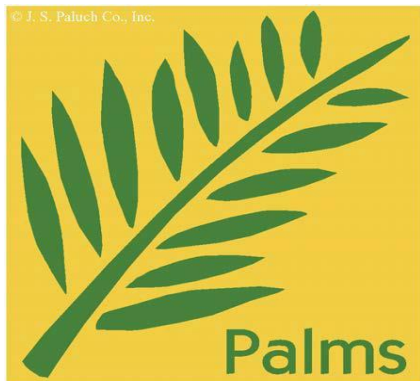

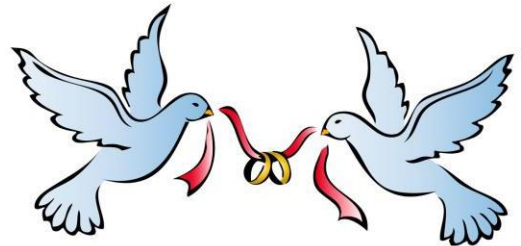

HAPPY EASTER FROM IMMACULATE CONCEPTION CHURCH

To Assist You In Your Preparation For The Sacrament of Penance We Offer the Following:

Examination of Conscience:

The Ten Commandments:

- 1. I am the Lord, your God, you shall not have strange gods before me:** The occult or superstition; denial of faith in Jesus, His teachings and church; allowing others to belittle our faith; fully participating in other religions (receiving communion in non-catholic churches); not praying.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain:** Cursing, blasphemy, swearing; invoking the name of Christ and God irreverently.
- 3. Keep holy the Lord's Day:** Not participating in the Mass on Sundays or Holy Days; unnecessary work on this one day meant for God, family and rest; receiving Communion without Confession when aware of a serious sin.
- 4. Honor your father and your mother:** Young children must obey and respect their parents; all must respect and aid parents; respect those in authority, obedience to just laws, parents and all in authority must live honorable lives.
- 5. You shall not kill:** anything to do with abortion which is murder; suicide, euthanasia; serious injury of health by drugs, alcohol, etc.; violence in deed or word against another person.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery:** Any physical expression of sexual love outside of marriage; pornography; immodesty; within marriage sexuality is the expression of love and openness to life.
- 7. You shall not steal:** Stealing; destruction of property; fraud; unfair wages; cheating on tests or homework; doing less than paid for; neglect of the poor; gambling which causes hardship.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness:** Lying; speaking damaging truth about another to someone who has no right to that knowledge; gossip.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife:** Lustfully considering another person as a sex object.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods:** Jealousy and envy of another's talents and goods.

The Great Commandment: *You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your mind, with all your strength and you shall love your neighbor as yourself.*

To receive the Sacrament of Penance one should first examine your conscience and try to remember when your last confession was. There is no sin and time that cannot be forgiven! When you approach the priest, either anonymously or face to face, you may use a formula such as "Bless me father, for I have sinned; it has been (how long) since my last confession". Or just tell the priest you are unsure and he will help you. The priest will give you your penance (prayers to say or something to do) and ask you to recite an Act of Contrition (this may be a memorized prayer, "O my God, I am heartily sorry..." or any version; as simple as "Jesus have mercy on me a sinner," or something from the heart.) After the priest gives you absolution, carry out your penance as soon as possible. Remember, if a priest yelled at you 40 years ago, he's dead a long time or you might have needed it. But primarily, the priest is there to represent the Lord who loves you and forgives you.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Lord is truly risen, Alleluia! Around the world and across Long Island, we proclaim this marvelous truth. Good news is ours. Sin and death have been vanquished. Christ has conquered. God is victorious!

In light of the suffering and death of the past year, how blessed we are to behold again the Mystery of the Resurrection. These months have been dark and bleak. They have been long and challenging. Yet, as we encounter Easter 2021, we are reminded that God has the final word. Indeed, *Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it* (John 1:5). This Light, Jesus Christ, illumines our path. He gives hope. As the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council said:

Through Christ and in Christ, the riddles of sorrow and death grow meaningful. Apart from His Gospel, they overwhelm us. Christ has risen, destroying death by His death; He has lavished life upon us so that...we can cry out in the Spirit: Abba, Father.¹

With significant challenges facing us still on Long Island and across the globe, with darkness still afoot, perhaps the joy of Easter is difficult to embrace. Our hearts maybe like those of the disciples who went on Easter dawn to anoint the Lord's body. At the strange sight of an empty tomb and an apparently absent Jesus, instead of experiencing immediate joy, they were confused and distressed. Only in seeing the Lord face to face did they come to embrace His rising from the dead.

Like Mary Magdalene and the other disciples, we need to see Christ alive among us. We need to see the Resurrection in our midst. So, this Easter, let us ask, "Where is Christ alive?"

Christ is alive in the countless frontline workers, civil servants, and medical professionals who have served so faithfully and so heroically this past year. Their sacrificial love and Good Samaritan-willingness to help neighbors in need radiate the Lord Jesus!

Christ is alive in the catechumens who have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. Their reception of the Sacraments reminds us of the power of our own Baptism - where each of us has died with Christ and risen with Him to new life.

Above all, Christ is alive in His risen and glorified presence in the Eucharist and in the transforming power of His Body and Blood that we receive in the celebration of the Mass. Christ

Pascua 2021

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

El Señor verdaderamente ha resucitado, ¡Aleluya! En todo el mundo y en Long Island, proclamamos esta maravillosa verdad. Las buenas noticias son nuestras. El pecado y la muerte han sido vencidos. Cristo ha vencido. ¡Dios es victorioso!

A la luz del sufrimiento y la muerte del año pasado, cuán bendecidos somos al contemplar nuevamente el Misterio de la Resurrección. Estos meses han sido oscuros y sombríos. Han sido largos y desafiantes. Sin embargo, al encontrarnos con la Pascua de 2021, se nos recuerda que Dios tiene la última palabra. De hecho, *la luz brilla en las tinieblas y las tinieblas no la vencieron* (Juan 1: 5). Esta Luz, Jesucristo, ilumina nuestro camino. Él da esperanza. Como dijeron los Padres del Concilio Vaticano II:

A través de Cristo y en Cristo, los dilemas del dolor y la muerte cobran significado. Apartados de Su Evangelio, nos agobian. Cristo ha resucitado, destruyendo la muerte con su muerte; Él nos ha prodigado vida para que ... podamos clamar en el Espíritu: Abba, Padre. ¹

Con los importantes desafíos que enfrentamos todavía en Long Island y en todo el mundo, con la oscuridad aun en pie, quizás la alegría de la Pascua sea difícil de abrazar. Nuestros corazones tal vez sean como los de los discípulos que fueron el amanecer de Pascua a ungir el cuerpo del Señor. Ante la extraña visión de una tumba vacía y un Jesús aparentemente ausente, en lugar de experimentar un gozo inmediato, se sintieron confundidos y angustiados. Solo al ver al Señor cara a cara llegaron a comprender Su resurrección de entre los muertos.

Como María Magdalena y los otros discípulos, necesitamos ver a Cristo vivo entre nosotros. Necesitamos ver la resurrección entre nosotros. Entonces, en esta Pascua, preguntémonos: "¿Dónde está vivo Cristo?"

Cristo está vivo en los innumerables trabajadores de primera línea, funcionarios públicos y profesionales médicos que han servido tan fie) y heroicamente el año pasado. ¡Su amor sacrificado y su buena voluntad samaritana para ayudar a los vecinos necesitados irradian al Señor Jesús!

Cristo esta vivo en los catecumenos que han recibido los sacramentos del Bautismo, la Eucaristía y la Confirmación en la Vigilia Pascual. Su recepción de los sacramentos nos recuerda el poder de nuestro propio bautismo, donde cada uno de nosotros ha muerto con Cristo y ha resucitado con El a una nueva vida.

Sobre todo, Cristo esta vivo en Su presencia resucitada y glorificada en la Eucaristía y en el poder transformador de Su Cuerpo y Sangre que recibimos en la celebración de la Misa. Cristo esta vivo, y por lo tanto la Iglesia esta viva. La Eucaristía es la fuente de esta vida, y su poder se ha vuelto quizás más evidente que nunca, después de meses de separación de la celebración semanal y diaria de la Misa. Juntos, recordamos el reconocimiento de los discípulos de Jesús después de la Resurrección en Emaús en la apertura de las Escrituras y la fracción del pan. Estamos agradecidos por las muchas formas en que nuestras parroquias y escuelas han seguido fomentando creativamente esta experiencia de Emaús en Long Island, tanto en persona como virtualmente. Que podamos seguir reconociendo la Eucaristía Dominical como la fuente de la cual brota en el mundo la vida de Cristo Resucitado.

En su Angelus dominical del 3 de enero de 2021, el Papa Francisco nos recordó bellamente la presencia continua de Cristo entre nosotros:

"Me gusta pensar que cuando el Señor ora al Padre por nosotros, no se limita a hablar: le muestra las heridas de la carne, le muestra las heridas que sufrió por nosotros. Este es Jesús: con su carne es el intercesor, el quiso llevar los signos del sufrimiento. Jesús, con su carne, esta ante el Padre. De hecho, el Evangelio dice que *El vino a morar entre nosotros*. No vino a visitarnos y luego se fue; vino a vivir con nosotros, a quedarse con nosotros".²

Que podamos seguir encontrando la presencia de Jesucristo que habita en y a través de Su Iglesia. Que sigamos experimentando los signos de Su Resurrección incluso en medio de los desafíos y cruces que abrazamos, y que este encuentro continúe llenando nuestros corazones, para que nuestras voces puedan clamar con confianza: ¡E/ Señor verdaderamente ha resucitado! ¡A/eluya!
