

Anointing of the Sick

The Anointing of the sick is offered the 2nd Friday of each month after the 8:00am Mass or you may contact the rectory for an appointment.

The Sacrament will be offered again on: Friday, October 13th in the Church

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.





As we enter the beautiful season of autumn, it is a wonderful time to reflect on the spiritual growth and expansion of our faith, especially as we approach the culmination of our liturgical year. I pray that you and your loved ones are well and that you have a blessed holiday season with them. I would like to express my gratitude to you and your fellow parishioners for the prayers and support that have been offered on behalf of our parish.

It is evident that when we come together as a parish, we can reap the benefits of many ministries and services that one person cannot do alone. This holds true for our diocese as well; when our Parishes come together as *One Family* we sow the seeds of the love of our faith with others and journey with those in need.

Long Island is known for its quality of life; it is hard to believe that there are many people who must make difficult decisions on basic living expenses. Although inflation has eased a bit, the rising prices of food, gas at the pump, utilities, and of course housing continue to negatively impact a family's budget.

Support for those in need is crucial for many families, especially our senior community. Our Long Island community has had a 25% to 30% increase in the senior demographic, leading to an increase of 65% of these seniors living in poverty. Your donation allows Catholic Charities to provide affordable safe housing to senior citizens, operating 16 housing facilities in Nassau and Suffolk counties, totaling more than 1,329 units.

Additionally, it ensures the physical, social, and spiritual well-being of residents. Housing programs are also available for those with developmental disabilities and our veterans in need. Through our Parish Social Ministry programs, we bring food and hope during these challenging times. I would like to share a comment from a senior and resident of Bishop Ryan Village, Hampton Bays with you:

"My neighbors and I often say that we are tremendously relieved to have dignified, affordable housing and are very grateful to this ministry of the Church assisting us in our time need."

Your gift to the CMA also provides funding to educate our seminarians and provide faith formation to our young people and lay leaders, more than 600,000 are served each year. If you have not had an opportunity to make a gift to the Catholic Ministries Appeal, I ask you to prayerfully consider a gift. Please know that 100% of every dollar raised is restricted to fund the objectives, programs, and mission supported by the Catholic Ministries Appeal and every gift makes a difference in the lives of others no matter the amount.

Una Familia Caminando juntos en Comunión, Participación y Misión

Al comenzar la hermosa estación de otoño, también nos acercamos al final de nuestro año litúrgico, por lo que es tiempo propicio para reflexionar sobre nuestro crecimiento espiritual y cómo estamos aumentando nuestra <u>fe.</u> Elevo mis oraciones para que usted y sus seres queridos se encuentren bien y que juntos puedan compartir las bendiciones de las festividades. A nombre de la parroquia, quiero agradecer a usted y a todos nuestros feligreses por sus oraciones y por su apoyo.

Cuando las personas nos juntamos, agrupándonos como una parroquia, podemos beneficiarnos de muchos ministerios y servicios que una persona por sí sola no podría ofrecer. Algo similar sucede con nuestra diócesis; cuando las parroquias nos juntamos, agrupándonos como *Una Familia*, podemos sembrar en otras personas la semilla del amor por nuestra fe y caminar junto a los más necesitados, acompañándolos y auxiliándolos.

Long Island se caracteriza por su calidad de vida; por ello es difícil creer que existen tantas personas que deben tomar decisiones drásticas para afrontar gastos básicos. Si bien la inflación ha cedido un poco, los aumentos en el precio de alimentos, gasolina, utilidades y vivienda continúan teniendo un impacto negativo en el presupuesto familiar.

La ayuda destinada a aquellos que tienen pocos recursos es crucial para muchas familias, especialmente para los adultos mayores. Aquí en Long Island, la población de ancianos se ha incrementado 25% a 30%, lo cual ha ocasionado un aumento de 65% en la cantidad de ancianos que viven en situación de pobreza. Con su donativo, Caridades Católicas puede continuar operando 16 locaciones de vivienda digna y asequible para ancianos, un total de 1,329 unidades habitables en los condados de Nassau y Suffolk.

Además, incluyen actividades físicas, sociales y espirituales para los residentes. Los programas de vivienda también se ofrecen a otras personas necesitadas, como veteranos y a personas que tienen discapacidad del desarrollo. A través de los programas de Alcance Social Parroquiales, entregamos alimentos y esperanza durante tiempos difíciles. Quisiera compartirles este mensaje de un anciano que reside en la casa Bishop Ryan Village en Hampton Bays:

"Mis vecinos y yo siempre decimos que para nosotros es un gran alivio tener una vivienda digna y asequible. Estamos sumamente agradecidos a este ministerio de la iglesia que nos ayuda con esta necesidad"

Su aporte a favor de la Campaña de Apoyo a Los Ministerios Católicos (CMA) también provee fondos para la educación de nuestros seminaristas y para la formación de fe de jóvenes y líderes laicos, más de 600,000 personas reciben ayuda cada año. Si usted aún no ha colaborado, le pido que en oración considere hacer donativo. 
