A MESSAGE FROM DEACON MARK

It's a wonderful time to watch "It's a Wonderful Life."

The leadup to Christmas, and especially Christmas Eve, has become the occasion for millions of people to watch the 1947 classic movie that is set on Christmas Eve. It follows lead character George Bailey, whose financial distress on top of many broken dreams provokes him to commit suicide, and the guardian angel, Clarence, who is sent down to save him.

No need for spoiler alerts. Because the film has been



around for more than 75 years—and is televised by NBC every December 24—chances are good that you know the ending. The beauty is in watching it all play out, in seeing the transformation from despair to joy and in realizing that George Bailey's life has been so wonderful because of the great way it has helped so many others.

Watching it every year reminds us that much of what we love about the Advent and Christmas seasons is the traditions. We love that they stay the same.

But at the same time, we also love a great story about change. All of the Christmas classics—Scrooge, Rudolph, Charlie Brown's Christmas tree—involve great transformation. Truth is, God loves a transformation story, too. So, he has completely changed the world and the prospect of everyone in it by entering it himself as a baby.

"It's a Wonderful Life" annually testifies to this great joy. There is something new to embrace every time.

The Catholic website Aleteia last year offered an article by Father Peter John Cameron listing the similarities between George Bailey and St. Joseph. Each is married to a woman named Mary. Each saved a child's life (George rescued his brother as a youth, Joseph safely brought Jesus and Mary to Egypt). Each put his own long-range plans on hold. Each put himself at the service of other people, without asking for credit.

Food for thought, for sure. Then again, "It's a Wonderful Life" works deeply in the heart, probably more so than in the mind.

It has been written that Jimmy Stewart, the lead actor who plays George Bailey, was melancholy when he began filming. He was reportedly emotionally drained by having been a bomber pilot in World War II. He was nervous about his future, what with younger actors ready to take his place. Plus, he thought it was just so frivolous to do something as lighthearted as acting in movies.

Lionel Barrymore, the iconic movie star who plays George's nemesis Mr. Potter, changed his colleague's outlook by asking Jimmy Stewart, "Isn't it better to entertain people than to drop bombs on them?" Jimmy agreed. His approach changed. And his joy in the final scene of the movie was deep and genuine. The actor, as well as the lead character, had a new lease on life.

Jesus specifically wants each of us to have a new lease on life, this life and eternal life. He comes to every heart at Christmas to offer new hope.

I asked God to give me happiness. And God said no. He said he gives blessings. Happiness is up to me.

I asked God to spare me pain.

And God said no. He said suffering draws you apart from worldly care. And brings you closer to him.


I asked God to make my spirit grow.
