FROM DEACON MARK'S DESK ...

So, which is your favorite quote from St. Joseph? Maybe the time he said.... Or perhaps the time he spoke out on.... Or possibly the comment he made about....

Truth is, not once in all of the bible do we read anything that St. Joseph said. He is never quoted. But we sure do have evidence of what he did. So much so that the church dedicates the entire month of March to St. Joseph and celebrates him in a special way every March 19. His feast is officially considered a Solemnity on the church calendar, as opposed to a Commemoration (such as, for instance, St. Patrick on March 17 and St. Cyril of Jerusalem on March 18).

St. Joseph holds a distinctive and vital place in all of salvation history. We do see in the bible, at the start of Matthew's gospel, that he came from the holy line of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Judah and David. By agreeing to take Mary into his home and act as protector for her and Jesus, Joseph opened the way for every one of us to be saved.

The fact he never is given a speaking part in any of the gospels shows he personified the expression: actions speak louder than words. He taught Jesus the ways of work and ways of the world. Envisioning Joseph and Jesus going to their job every day, it is easy to think of them as best friends.

We associate Joseph with Advent, not Lent. Notice he is never mentioned in the accounts of Jesus' final days, and that Mary is alone. Scholars agree that it appears Joseph had died some time earlier. But again, there is no obituary for him in scripture.

In his book, "Joseph: The Man Who Raised Jesus," Father Gary Caster writes: "I believe that we know a great deal about St. Joseph—more than if he had penned a Gospel of his own—from the person he raised, a man we know a great deal about."

Joseph is the protector of the church. He is a model of work, faith, obedience and hope. He is a model of respect for women and care for children.

Let's celebrate him in a special way this Tuesday, March 19. Wish anyone named Joseph a Happy Name Day. And who doesn't love a St. Joseph pastry (either custard or cannoli filling)?

To be sure, even though Joseph is not included in our Holy Week gospels, we know that Easter is a great occasion for him. As the Josephite Fathers say in a novena seeking favors from St. Joseph: "I ask it by the joy which filled your soul, when the Redeemer of the world, triumphant over death and hell, entered into the possession of His kingdom and led you into it with special honors."

A little about me - many of you know me, as the guy who is always busy running around checking things not once but twice and often leading the singing at mass.

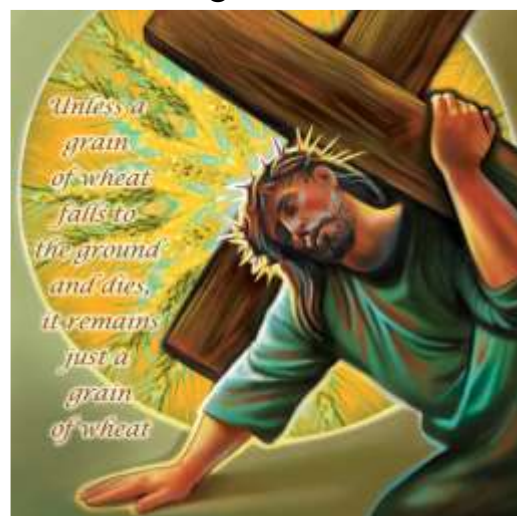
Although I do have my very quiet, prayerful moments, my spirituality comes by way of participation. The truth is I'm easily distracted. It is by way of a task that I focus on the meaning of what I'm doing. As anyone who prayed the rosary can tell you, that simple prayer can center you and help keep you focused on the bigger picture. I used to think that it was just a catchy or even "corny" phrase to say "those who sing pray twice" but literally, if I'm focused on the words of a hymn I'm singing or the purpose of the task I am performing (no matter how small) that becomes my prayer.

When setting our altar and credence table for mass, I can't help but reflect on the last supper and not only how important each item is but how important our presence is to the celebration of the Eucharist! What could be better than that? After all, could you imagine how different things may have turned out if one of the apostles didn't come or if no bread was prepared? I feel very fortunate to be your sacristan first and foremost. I look at preparation of the Altar for mass as a gift. One of the many things I love about our church and the Catholic faith is that everything we do has meaning, from the placement of the corporal on the altar right through to the colors that we display based on the liturgical season - it all has meaning, and in most cases deep meaning.

So, if I have a determined or even melancholy look on my face you might say I am in deep thought or prayer, but please do remind me that a smile is what Jesus calls us each to provide - in other words, don't hesitate to stop me if you see me running around to say "Hi," and I promise to return the greeting!

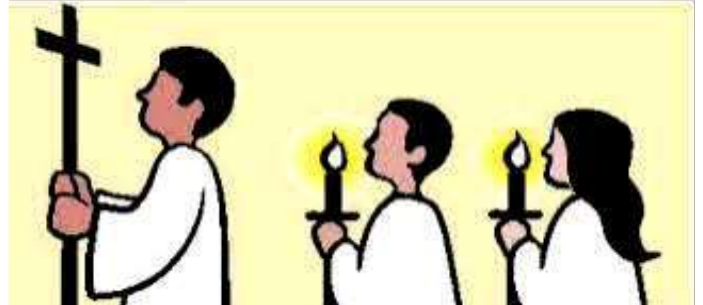
WOULD YOU LIKE TO BECOME AN ALTAR SERVER?

Altar servers are the boys and girls who assist the priest at Mass on Sundays and on other special occasions. They have an important leadership in the celebration of the Mass and are special people for giving and participating so actively in the Mass.

Duties of an Altar Server involve everything from assisting the priest, lighting candles, carrying the cross, ringing the bells and praying. They join with Jesus as they give their time in his service at the altar.

What you have to do

- Decide if you are willing to give this service to Jesus in your church. You have to be at the Mass you are assigned on Sundays as you would have to be at every practice and game on a sports team.
- Talk it over with your parents since this will affect them also. Remember, they have to get you there. Of course, if there is an occasional conflict, you can ask another altar server to substitute for you.
