

Can you believe Easter has come and gone already? The older I get, the faster time seems to fly! Easter has many, many, memories for me. I am a 1991 convert, having received my sacraments from Fr. Mirro just days after Christmas (mine was the only group in my parish to do that outside of Easter!). But Holy Week and Easter have always been my favorite time of year, spiritually speaking.

I can remember my very first Holy Thursday. I cried through the Mass, it was so moving. This was the "priests" Mass and to think that Jesus himself served others by washing the feet of his disciples, and we still do that today, just brought a very personal meaning to my life ... one that I still remember today and try to put it into action with others.

My husband of 34 years was an ordained Deacon for 18 years before his death and served the Diocese and Parish of St. Jude in Mastic Beach. We LIVED at the Church during Holy Week, as many of you could say the same. It's such a holy time of year. I can also remember a particular Good Friday, in all its solemness. A family that we were very friendly with had an older handicapped daughter with Spina bifida and was wheelchair bound. When the time came to venerate the Cross, our friend swooped his daughter up in his arms and brought her to the Cross so she could venerate it ... I'm telling you there was not a dry eye in the Church! I was just filled with emotion of all the things our friend does for his severely handicapped daughter ... and he never complained! So many of us are broken and have worries. We bring that to the foot of the Cross and ask Jesus to take it all from us ... and he does! So much love involved in surrendering it over and trusting that he will take care of us.



It's coming upon 7 years that my husband is gone now, and I still miss him terribly ... always will. But I have such beautiful memories of the many Holy Weeks we spent together ... loving one another and loving God ... we were truly blessed to share that life.

Now I am so blessed to be the Parish Secretary here at Immaculate Conception ... mixing the two things I love ... being a secretary and working for the Catholic Church. Fr. Ken, our Pastor, has been an amazing boss and my co-workers are a great group of people whom I look forward to seeing every day. Thank you to all for



allowing me to serve you. I look forward to becoming the "old" secretary ... one day! Hahaha









TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Most languages take the name for this fifty-day season from the Lord's Passover: Pasqua in Italian, Pâques in French, Paach in Dutch, Pascha in Greek and Russian. English has a much newer name, the name of a pagan goddess, Eoster. For centuries before Christianity took hold, in both Germany and Britain the spring equinox was dedicated to her and the concepts of fertility and rebirth. She was said to be a playful spirit, following the Sun King's chariot, and ending the reign of winter. She had a magical companion, a rabbit who hid eggs in the fields to coax plants and animals to rebirth. It was believed that Eoster once came across a bird with broken wings and saved it by turning it into a rabbit—an egg -laying rabbit at that! Although they were baptized, most people didn't take to the new Latin name (Pascha Domini) too easily, and kept calling the spring equinox by the old accustomed name. For good measure, they kept a pagan name for Christmas, too: Yule.




