ALL ARE SENT

Fifty days after Easter Sunday we celebrate the fulfillment of all God's promises in the feast of Pentecost, a feast that has sometimes been called the birthday of the church. One last time we are reminded that we Christians have received the Holy Spirit, not for our own benefit, but to enable us to follow our Christian vocation.

The centerpiece of the scriptures for Pentecost is the account in Acts of the Apostles of the sending of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. The other readings for this Sunday help us to understand what it means to live out our Christian vocation. Paul's letter shows us the gifts and fruits that the Holy Spirit gives to us. John's Gospel reminds us that Jesus has sent all his disciples to share his forgiveness and peace, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

MUSIC AS AN INSPIRATION AT MASS AND IN MY LIFE

"I will sing to the Lord as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have being" (Psalm 104:33)

Music is something that I grew up with in my home. Whether it was my father's polkas he loved to play or my mom's old classics like Dean Martin & Frank Sinatra, just to name a few. For me, I truly love all types of music.

As a child going to church every Sunday at Immaculate Conception was what I especially loved. The Catholic hymns at mass touched me and moved me so much. I recall going to mass, usually the 11am but also the 9:30am folk mass.

I must have been 4 years old (and older), when I got the privilege of watching Mr. Stevens cantor at Immaculate Conception and his family singing in the choir. They made mass so beautiful with their familiar hymns. At the end of every mass, he would tell us all how beautiful we sounded! Such a small gesture made us all feel so happy! Mr. Stevens was one of my inspirations. I said to my mother at a very young age that someday I was going to be up there singing and cantering in this church just like him.

Music was not the only thing that I enjoyed at church. I also love the homilies. I remember watching and listening so intently to every word the priest said. Some of the time thinking he was talking directly to me. So many things they said touched me and made me want to be more of a part of the church and become closer to God. I felt so welcomed, it was like we were all one big family.

As I got a bit older, I continued to come to church with my family weekly. Some may say they didn't want to go to church, but I was different. I was excited to go, I looked forward to it. When the hymns were played I probably sang louder than anyone in church!

One day I had the pleasure of meeting Jeanne Lewin who ran the folk group at Immaculate Conception Church for years. She asked me to be part of the folk group and sing with them. To say I was excited was an understatement! I was thrilled to be asked and to be part of the folk group. The harmonies and the songs were always amazing. Jeanne was always one of my biggest inspirations she is to this day. She taught me so much!

Later after singing with the folk group for a few years I was asked if I would be interested in being a cantor and singing the 5pm mass. I couldn't believe it! It was a dream come true for me.

I was extremely nervous but when I met the organist at the time, Jackie Bennett, she was truly amazing! So sweet, kind and made me feel so welcome and comfortable. Her love of music inspired me even more. She had such talent on the organ. Every hymn sounded beautiful. We were a team Jackie and I. We enjoyed several years together at the 5pm mass.

I follow my musical journey every week continuing to sing and be inspired at mass not only by music but by Gods word.

Whether it's singing at Immaculate Conception, St. John's, or St. Isadore's, or my life's dream of receiving an invitation to try out for the National Cathedral in Washington DC (the pandemic interfered with that dream, but I was honored to be recognized and invited to tryout). I will continue to offer my gift of song to the church and everyone that comes to mass. My singing journey in church has now been over 37 years and counting. My history with Immaculate conception goes back over 55 years. I am blessed to be a part of this parish and to have met so many wonderful and inspiring people along the way!

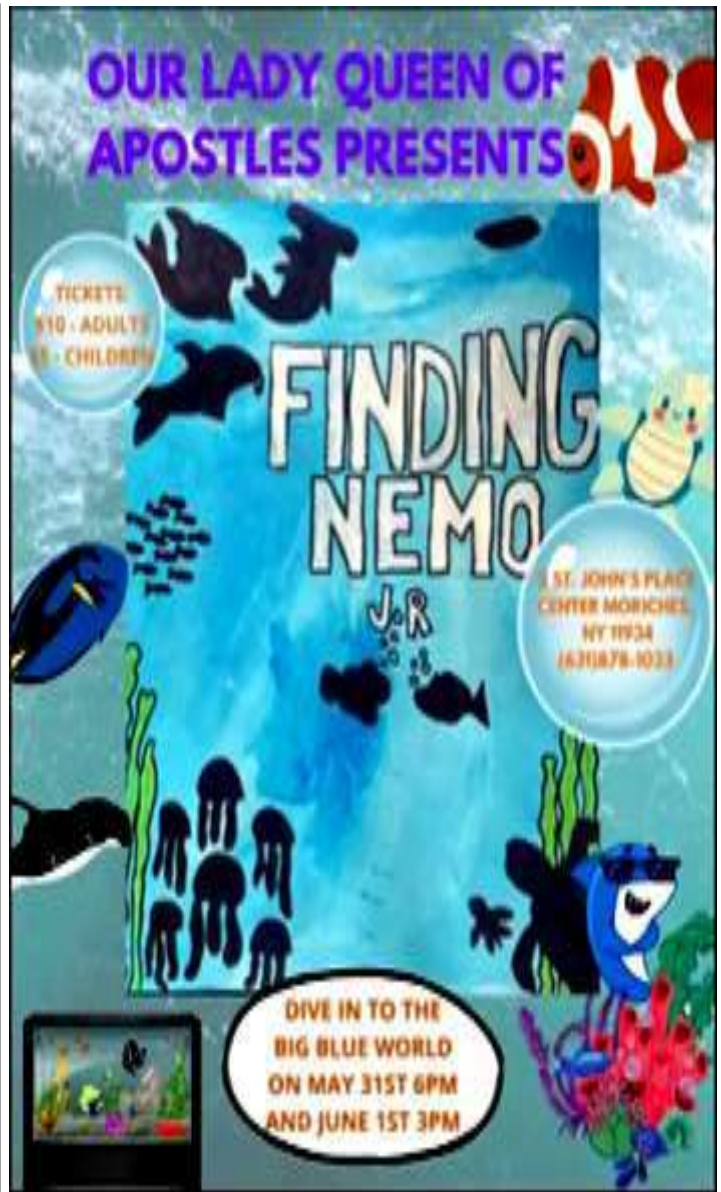

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



The disciples gathered on the fiftieth day after the Resurrection were not keeping their first Pentecost. For them, Pentecost was the fiftieth day after Passover, a feast of the first fruits of the harvest. It was the second most important feast of the year. Today, Jews gather on the eve of the feast to study scripture and the law, and after the feast begins at sundown, spend the day in joyful social gatherings. The meaning of the celebration is the giving of the law on Mount Sinai, so for Christians the connection to the gifts of the Holy Spirit is obvious. In Sicily and in the Pantheon in Rome, today the descent of the Holy Spirit is enacted with a stunning ritual. Some churches there have an “eye” in the roof open to the sky, called an *oculus*. After the Gospel today, thousands of rose petals fall from the *oculus* onto the assembly. Churches and homes are decked in greenery and flowers to express the new life the Holy Spirit brings on this, the “birthday of the church.”

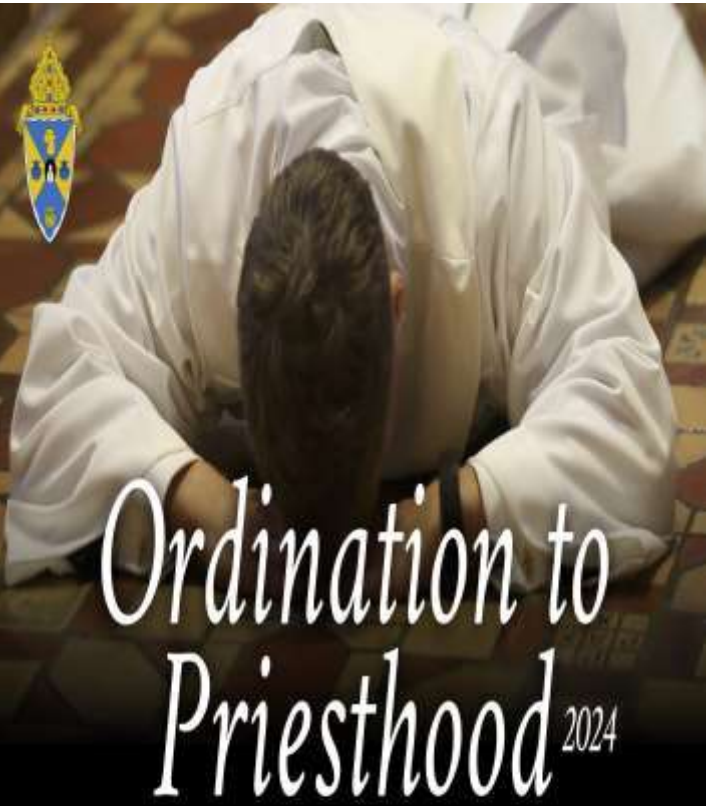
