




"God is Love" Month of the Sacred Heart

June is known as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus because the solemnity of the Sacred Heart is celebrated during this month. This year, the solemnity falls on June 16th. The date changes each year because it is celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave, or the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost. Here is some historical context about why June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart:

In 1673, a French nun named Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque, who belonged to the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary (Visitandines) in eastern France, began receiving visions about the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During these visions, Jesus appeared to her and revealed ways to venerate His Sacred Heart. He explained the immense love He has for humanity, appearing with His heart visible outside His chest, on fire, and surrounded by a crown of thorns.

The different ways to honor the Sacred Heart include partaking in a holy hour and receiving the Eucharist on the first Friday of every month. Jesus told Sister Margaret Mary: "My Sacred Heart is so

intense in its love for men, and for you in particular, that not being able to contain within it the flames of its ardent charity, they must be transmitted through all means." These visions continued for 18 months.

On June 16, 1675, Jesus instructed Sister Margaret Mary to promote a feast that honored His Sacred Heart. He also gave her 12 promises for all who venerate and promote the devotion of the Sacred Heart. Among these promises was the request for a special feast on the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi, dedicated to His heart. Jesus promised abundant graces and divine love to those who honored His Sacred Heart in this way.

Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque passed away in 1690 and was later canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 13, 1920. Although the Vatican was initially hesitant to declare a feast for the Sacred Heart, the devotion spread throughout France. In 1765, the Vatican granted the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to France. Then, in 1856, Pope Pius IX designated the Friday following the feast of Corpus Christi as the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and His immense love for all of us.

Today, the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a solemnity, the highest-ranking feast in the liturgical calendar, although it is not a holy day of obligation. The devotion to the Sacred Heart continues to inspire countless believers worldwide, inviting them to reflect on God's boundless love and mercy.

Please be sure to find & take a Prayer Card to the Sacred Heart (found in the Church) and participate in this prayerful month of June!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



The reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting

contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ's total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God's own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.

On Sundays, this self-giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. Yet the acts of giving from our abundance and attending to the needs of the poor open us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires.


