

#### **Supporting our Seminarians**



#### **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Careful readers of the "Treasures" will have noticed that the two columns about the oldest monastic communities in the United States refer to the colonial states. The Louisiana Purchase gained a great treasure for our nation, the Ursuline monastery of New Orleans. Among the greatest pioneers of that city were nuns who came from France on a perilous voyage in 1727, pestered by pirates and tossed by fearsome storms. These were genteel, well-educated Ursulines, yet their first task was to roll up their sleeves and open a hospital to care for the pestilence-ridden colony. Next, they opened a school for girls and launched a plan to educate the women being shipped over from France to marry settlers. In this way, they had enormous influence in molding patterns of family and domestic life.

At Christmastime in 1814, the threat of a British assault on the city was growing. On the terrifying night of January 7, 1815, the women of New Orleans gathered in the monastery chapel to pray that the city be spared from destruction in battle. The mother superior made a vow to have a Mass of Thanksgiving on that date every year should the Americans win. That night, Our Lady of Prompt Succor, to whom the nuns had great devotion, became the protector and patron of this great city. The convent in the French Quarter is the oldest standing building in the Mississippi valley, and the only surviving building of the French colonial period. The nuns relocated in 1824, but their old monastery is preserved as a museum and archives for the Archdiocese of New Orleans. The school the nuns began, Ursuline Academy, is the oldest continuously operating Catholic school, and school for women, in the United States.

#### YEAR END TAX SAVING TIPS FOR YOUR IRA by Mark Henry



Every year parishioners pay too much in taxes without realizing that they did not need to overpay. For the financially savvy, tax planning with retirement accounts like IRAs and 401(k)s can enable them to support charities like the Church with tax-wise giving strategies.

For many people, a retirement account like an IRA or 401(k) may be the most significant source of assets accumulated in their lifetime.

Others may find that, due to their other resources and investments, they are not in need of all the funds accumulated in their retirement accounts. For those who wish to give to the Church, a natural question is whether they can donate retirement assets—and if there are any tax advantages for doing so.

There are a couple of options for donating retirement assets. One way is to donate during your lifetime. In order to donate retirement plan assets during your lifetime you would need to take a distribution from the retirement account, include the distribution in your income for that year, account for any taxes associated with the distribution, and then contribute cash to the charity —with one exception. People who are age 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  or older can contribute up to \$100,000 from their IRA directly to a charity and avoid paying income taxes on the distribution. This is known as a *qualified charitable distribution*. It is limited to IRAs, and there are other exclusions and considerations as well.

Another way to donate all or a portion of your retirement asset is through your estate plan. There can be significant tax advantages to donating retirement assets to charity as part of an estate plan. When done properly, charitable donations of retirement assets can minimize the amount of income taxes imposed on both your individual heirs and your estate.

Give yourself a present in the New Year by reducing your taxes now.

With simple strategies, you can reduce your taxes and finish the tax year by helping the Church. You worked hard for what you have. Don't give it away in taxes without knowing all the possibilities for reducing the tax bite.
