St. Paul's epistle is filled with many treasures including some you may already be familiar with - popular verses such as "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13. Also included in this Bible Study book are prayers and meditations along with fabulous colorful Religious artwork from Masters of the Renaissance and other time periods! We also discuss the artwork and how the Church uses Religious Paintings and Art to teach and inspire.

INTRODUCTION TO THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

In thanksgiving for healing in times of sickness, and for the gift of reconciliation, we offer this prayer of gratitude and praise.

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY

Take a look around you as you make yourself at home in God's home. As you entered, did you welcome others as perhaps you yourself were welcomed? Did you see anyone you did not recognize? Did you give them the once over and make a judgment, perhaps in the back of your mind? In today's second reading, James instructs the Christian community to show no partiality in their assembly. He warns them that those they may tend to avoid or ignore may be exactly those whom God chooses for the kingdom. In that spirit, let us always warmly welcome all who join us to worship the Lord.

September is an exciting time for kids and parents. In academia, students and teachers are starting anew with each other and there is an opportunity to start fresh, regardless of what happened in the past year. Perhaps your child is starting a new sport or honing skills and advancing to the next level of play. It's also a wonderful time to deepen a youngster's faith. Effectively engaging in religious formation classes involves both parents and children actively participating and collaborating with the intention of deepening their understanding of faith and fostering spiritual growth.

Below are some suggestions to help parents ensure their children can get the most out of their religious formation classes:

- **Be Actively Involved:** Attend parent-teacher meetings, workshops, and events related to the religious formation program. This shows your commitment to your child's spiritual development and allows you to stay informed about their progress.
- **Attend Worship Services:** Regularly attend Mass and even add a special prayer service, such as Eucharistic Adoration as a family. This reinforces the connection between what is learned in formation classes and the practice of faith in a community setting.
- **Open Communication:** Maintain regular communication with your child's religious education teacher or coordinator. Share any concerns, questions, or suggestions you might have. This partnership can enhance your child's formation experience.
- **Supplement Learning at Home:** Reinforce the lessons learned in class by discussing them at home. Incorporate religious activities, such as reading from scripture, praying together, and participating in family devotions. You do not need all the answers. The pastoral staff at your parish would be happy to meet with you to discuss any thoughts, or questions you may have in understanding Church teachings.
- **Model Faith:** Children often learn through observation. Demonstrate your faith through your own actions, prayers, and participation in parish ministry.

Religious formation is a lifelong journey. Both parents and children can benefit from ongoing engagement in their parish with an openness to learning, and a commitment to growing in their faith.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



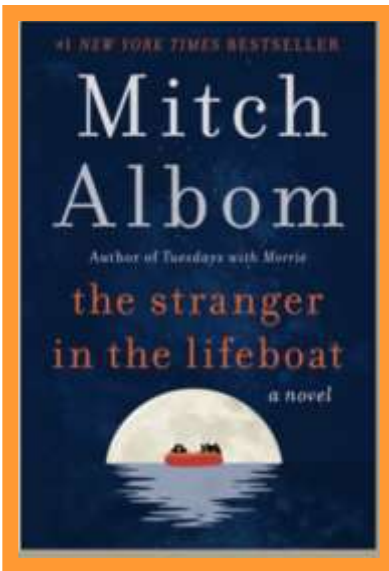
Back to work we go! Summer break is over and there is much to accomplish in school and in the workplace. It's a venerable Catholic custom to assign patron saints to the trades and occupations of life.

This is largely in the realm of popular devotion, and although from time to time the Vatican declares a saint to be patron of this or that, the process is free-wheeling and just about uncontrollable. Still, there is a saint for almost any purpose, whether you are on death row (Dismas), having eye trouble (Lucy), or pursued by poisonous toads (Hubert). Medieval guilds would often associate themselves with heavenly patrons, so Saint Joseph has the carpenters, Thomas More the lawyers, and physicians get Saint Luke. If you're stuck in the airport, St. Joseph of Cupertino is on call since he was said to rise off the floor when he prayed, and if you're in a long line at the ATM, Saint Anthony Claret is for you.

In recent years, the Vatican has from time to time assigned a new patronage, as when Saint Aloysius Gonzaga was named the patron of HIV-AIDS patients, since as a young Jesuit novice he had cared for his fellow novices during a terrible plague. Anything that matters to us—nation, parish church, occupation, illness—can have a patron, and it is an aspect of Catholicism that has enormous appeal. To believe in the “communion of saints” is to know that the ties that bind us as a communion do not unravel with death, and that when we stand before life's struggles, we do not stand alone. Who is your patron saint?

Real Presence National Eucharistic Revival 2022-2025

The revival was developed by our US bishops after the USCCB (US Conference of Catholic Bishops) June, 2021 vote to focus on Christ's true presence in the Eucharist - the source and summit of Christian life. (Catechism of the Catholic Church no. 1324)

Spanning from the 2022 Feast of Corpus Christi - the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ to Pentecost 2025, the faithful in the United States will celebrate the **National Eucharistic Revival**.

The USCCB outlined the mission of their three year event as a “renewal of “the church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This revival has four significant components:

* Year of Diocesan Revival - June 19, 2022 - June 11, 2023 - diocesan events centered around Christ's true presence in the Eucharist.

* Year of Parish Revival - June 11, 2023 to July 17, 2024 - parishes coordinate events for deeper encounters with Christ through Adoration, Mass, and enrichment.

* National Eucharistic Congress - July 17-21 2024 Catholics of all ages gathered in Indianapolis for a 5 day conference to build enthusiasm among the faithful to be “Eucharistic missionaries”.

* National Year of Mission - July 17,2024 to Pentecost 2025. All Catholics are encouraged to evangelize and be a light of Christ in the world.

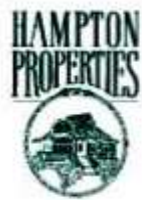

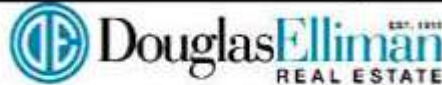
