

St. Paul's epistle is filled with many treasures including some you may already be familiar with - popular verses such as "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13. Also included in this Bible Study book are prayers and meditations along with fabulous colorful Religious artwork from Masters of the Renaissance and other time periods! We also discuss the artwork and how the Church uses Religious Paintings and Art to teach and inspire.

In the Eucharistic Prayer, we recall the marvelous deeds God has accomplished throughout history. Let us remember the one act that stands above all others: the saving death of Christ upon the cross. For this great gift we offer praise and thanks.

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY


WOULD YOU LIKE TO BECOME AN ALTAR SERVER?

Altar servers are the boys and girls who assist the priest at Mass on Sundays and on other special occasions. They have an important leadership in the celebration of the Mass and are special people for giving and participating so actively in the Mass.

Duties of an Altar Server involve everything from assisting the priest, lighting candles, carrying the cross, ringing the bells and praying. They join with Jesus as they give their time in his service at the altar.

What you have to do

- Decide if you are willing to give this service to Jesus in your church. You have to be at the Mass you are assigned on Sundays as you would have to be at every practice and game on a sports team.

WALK WITH ONE Everyone Can Evangelize

We are all called to evangelize, and thanks to the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are all well- equipped for this mission. It may not mean spreading the gospel in a foreign land or going door-to-door with the Good News - and it may require overcoming some fears- but the Lord is asking each of us to step out of our comfort zone and evangelize one-on- one.

There is someone in your life right now whom Jesus longs to call to Himself. He wants to spark a relationship with them and bless them with His sacraments. In this year of Mission (now until Pentecost 2025), Catholics across the U.S. are saying "yes" to a special form of heart-to-heart accompaniment called the *Walk with One* initiative. This is your opportunity to be God's instrument in the life of another person. Imagine how our families, neighborhoods, and country will be transformed if every active Catholic answers this call.

Spirit-led accompaniment has four natural stages: **Identify, Intercede, Connect and Invite.** These will be expanded upon in future bulletins; but for now, note that any effort must be grounded in prayer. Prayer is a vital part of evangelization, allowing us to stay attuned to the movements of the Holy Spirit. Root this whole journey in prayer with the **Eucharistic Examen.**

Throughout each stage of the journey, pray this examen to help you discern the path the Lord is calling you to follow in accompanying another person toward Jesus.


TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



In this country, we don't name our churches "The Fourth Avenue Catholic Church," but rather seek a patron saint or mystery of faith.

We inherit this tradition from an old Roman custom via medieval England. Interestingly, that has not been the practice elsewhere, and parishes abroad often do carry just the name of the neighborhood. In Ireland, the Roman (English) practices didn't take hold, and so churches are known simply by the street they are on, or by a nickname. Saint Francis of Assisi in Dublin is often called "Adam and Eve" after a pub in the same street. The pub sign is an interesting carving of our first parents, so they become patrons by default.

Increasingly in the United States, we are seeing a familiar European pattern emerge when a few churches, each bearing the name of a patron saint or mystery, are gathered into one parish that bears a different name. Thus, we might hear of a parish of "Midvalley City" comprised of Saint Mary, Saint Francis, and Saint Ursula churches. Once a church has been consecrated, its name may not normally be changed. Therefore, when parishes are merged, a new name is given to the parish, which may or may not be that of a heavenly patron, but the church buildings retain their names. In the process, we have lost sight of some worthy patrons of old, but have also seen new parishes open dedicated to twentieth-century saints like Edith Stein, Katharine Drexel, and Mother Teresa.



LISTENING AND RESPONDING

There are three interwoven themes in today's readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?




The Suffering Servant of Isaiah undergoes much distress and ridicule, but is able to bear it because he has listened to the promptings of God day after day. The psalm tells us that God listens, too. God hears our prayers for help and is always ready to save us. As our faith deepens, so does our desire to do the works of justice and charity that build up the reign of God. God directs our actions in ways we often cannot see, and we don't always see the results. We are called upon in faith to trust that what we do is enough, and that willingness to listen to God's promptings will lead us in the right way.

Liturgical Minister Training-Fall 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.

You may not take EMHC Part A and the Lector Workshop on the same day.


