

As you may recall, on December 4, 2024, the Federal Bankruptcy Court confirmed a plan ending the Bankruptcy Case for the Diocese of Rockville Centre, all our parishes, and related ministries. At that point the only remaining step was for each of the Parishes to make an abbreviated Chapter 11, Bankruptcy filing. On March 31, 2025 the court issued a Final Decree closing those cases for our Parish as well as many others. As a result, this matter and the associated claims it represents are fully resolved and closed.

This closes a difficult time for all Catholic Parishes in the Diocese of Rockville Center. At this Easter Time, a time of resurrection- a new beginning, we can be comforted that those who were harmed have received some measure of healing and that the mission of our Church on Long Island and our Parish will continue.

May the blessed promise of the risen Christ bring joy to all your days, and peace to your heart.


# TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION
