

In the psalm, we proclaim that we too are sheep of the Lord's flock. In a vision, John sees the Lamb of God shepherding a great multitude to springs of life-giving water. Finally, Jesus tells us in the Gospel that he gives all his sheep eternal life and no one can take that away. May listening to God's word increase our faith in our Good Shepherd.



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Feasibility Study Executive Summary

Phase I Results- 56 Participants

Phase I consisted of confidential, in-person and phone interviews between the Feasibility Study consultants and a cross-section of Immaculate Conception Church parishioners. Of the **127** invited, **56** parishioners participated.

90% of interviewees responded with either an excellent or a good rating regarding the reputation of the parish.

Regarding the leadership and operations of the parish under Fr. Grooms, 80% of those interviewed felt he was doing either an excellent or a good job.

When asked whether their fellow parishioners would support a capital campaign, 85% or those interviewed said "yes".

The parish proposed to raise funds through a capital campaign. Regarding the proposal to raise funds for this endeavor through a capital campaign, 72% of the interviewees indicated that the proposals were an excellent or a good idea.

It is estimated that the first \$1,500,000 of our goal will be obtained from the first 127 pledges received {Low \$1,006,000 - High \$1,746,000}.

34 participants indicated that they would consider volunteering. **Nine** participants indicated that they would consider taking a leadership role.

Phase II Results- 47 Participants

During Phase II, the Feasibility Study consultants collected confidential questionnaires from the parish, either by paper or electronically. 47 parishioners returned their questionnaires.

93% of the respondents felt that the parish had either an excellent or a good reputation.

91% of the respondents felt that Fr. Grooms was doing either an excellent or a good job.

88% of respondents felt that their fellow parishioners would support a capital campaign.

74% of respondents felt that the proposal to raise funds through a capital campaign was either an excellent or a good idea.

When asked to consider a sacrifice over 3 years to raise the necessary funds for the projects, 70% of the respondents indicated that they would pledge.

20 participants indicated that they are willing to volunteer.

Recommendations

Lynch Development Associates recommends that Immaculate Conception Church move forward with a capital endeavor for the parish.

Based on the feedback received from potential major donors as well as consistently generous parishioners, Lynch Development Associates believes it is feasible for Immaculate Conception Church to raise \$2-2.5 **Million** in a 3-year capital campaign.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



Just as the early church consecrated women living alone in the world, today that consecration is available to women who take solemn vows as cloistered nuns (different from religious sisters), women who follow a way of life in communities called "secular institutes," and laywomen. Oddly, the ritual is not permitted for religious sisters. The prayers talk about the woman's self-gift to

Christ, and her self-gift to the Church. Up until recent years, this was a solemn ceremony performed only for cloistered nuns under certain circumstances. In its new form, we have a ritual that revives a very ancient and little-known way of life. Today, a woman can live independently at home, without association with any religious sisterhood or institute, yet be consecrated to holiness and service. Normally, a ring and/or a veil may be given in the liturgy of consecration. It is a rite very different from religious profession, where the sister makes promises or vows, and is rather an expression of approval and blessing for a way of life already embraced. Unlike ancient times, which valued actual virginity, the new rite may be celebrated for anyone provided there has never been a marriage and the woman has always lived a virtuous life.




