TODAY'S READINGS

Isaiah 58:7-10 When your fasting feeds the hungry, a new day dawns.

Psalms 112 "The just man is a light in darkness to the upright."

1 Corinthians 2:1-5 Paul's message doesn't rest on his own wisdom but on the power of the Spirit.

Matthew 5:13-16 You are the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

Light binds together today's scripture readings. Isaiah preaches that when we share what we have with those in need, light will drive out the dark. In the psalm we sing that the one who acts with justice is a light in the darkness. Paul tells the Corinthians that the power of the Holy Spirit has enlightened their faith. In the Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples to let their light shine, so the world can see the good that they do. As we listen to the words of scripture, let us appreciate the metaphor of light in expressing what God asks us to do.

ASH WEDNESDAY Mass Schedule February 18, 2026

Ashes will be distributed

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, a Christian season of repentance and preparation for Easter, marked most visibly by the placing of ashes on the forehead as a reminder of human mortality and the call to spiritual renewal. It's observed by many Western Christian traditions, including Catholics, Anglicans, Lutherans, and others.

- **Beginning of Lent:** It starts a 40-day period (excluding Sundays) of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving leading up to Easter.
- **Symbol of Ashes:** The ashes—usually from burned palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday—are placed on the forehead in the shape of a cross. They symbolize repentance, humility, and the biblical reminder “you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”
- **Biblical Roots:** While Ash Wednesday itself isn't commanded in Scripture, the use of ashes as a sign of repentance appears throughout the Old Testament (e.g., Job, Daniel, Jonah). Early Christian communities adopted this symbolism over time.

LENTEN REGULATIONS FAST AND ABSTINENCE

There is a limit of one full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for all between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive. All who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat on that day and ALL Fridays in Lent.

EASTER DUTY OBLIGATION

After they have received their First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season. Catholics are also bound to confess serious (mortal) sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter Season.

EASTER FLOWERS

Easter Flowers can be dedicated to or in memory of your loved ones. Their names will be printed in the bulletin after Easter. A minimum suggested offering is \$25. You may use the envelopes you receive in the mail or use envelopes you may find in the lobby of the Church and you can place them either in the collection baskets during Mass or drop off at the Parish Office. Thank you!

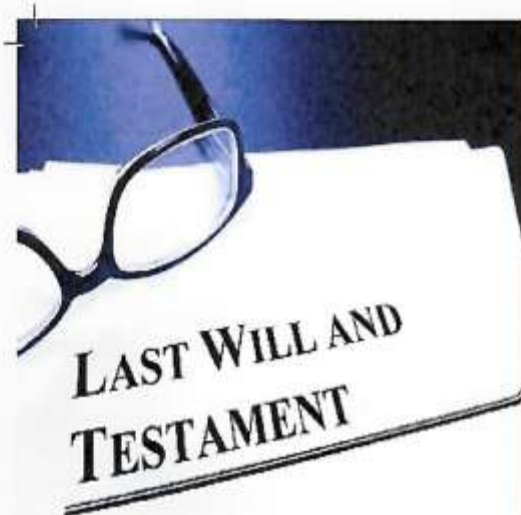

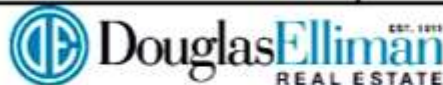
